Each ketubah is printed individually. Here is an explanation of the process for preparing the personalized ketubah text. The text is created with an artistic font in a adobe graphics program in 2 stages:

Stage 1 Typed Text

Preparation of text with personalization details as a typed version. The first draft will be sent by email to you as well as your rabbi for proofing. Corrections should be made at this stage

Stage 2 Text as Image

Once the stage 1 is approved, the text will be converted to an image and fitted to the artwork so that there are no spaces or overlapping letters. The text will again be sent for final approval, then combined with the image and finally sent for printing. (On the rare occasion that there are major changes at stage 2 there will be an additional charge since this requires starting the process over)

Considering the many nuances of ketubah wording, proof reading is the responsibility of the client and Rabbi who is performing your wedding. I do my best to enter the information accurately.
